PUBLIC HEARINGS

19. *Consideration of a Resolution to Install a Freestanding Wireless Communications Tower and a Resolution to Enter into a Lease Agreement at 8415 Meadowlark Lane (City Yard)*

1. Mayor Goodman opened the Public Hearing at 6:46p.m.
2. City Manager McNamara introduced the Item and Community Development Manager Deines gave the Staff Report
3. City Council Member Comments and Questions:

Discussion ensued regarding details of the vote results by the Development and Circulation Committee (DCC); that conditions were added for construction hours, environmental, and cell tower maintenance were added to address the concerns brought up at the meeting; that the applicant sent out their own notification to the residents regarding the matter.

4. Public Input:

Dale Oats, a La Palma resident, addressed the City Council regarding the height of this tower; his opposition to the health effects from radio frequency (RF) radiation exposure; that he's never had any issues with cell service in his home; and opposition to negative impacts on his property values as a result of the cell tower.

Florence Omolafe, a La Palma resident, addressed the City Council regarding her and the other resident's names being reflected on the DCC meeting minutes regarding this matter as attendees and speakers.

Roy Varughese, a La Palma resident, addressed the City Council regarding support for alternate solutions to cell service like the use of wi-fi versus a cell tower; his opposition to the health effects from RF radiation exposure and proximity of this tower to his residence; and asked the City Council to reconsider.

Nilesh Patel, a La Palma resident, addressed the City Council regarding his opposition to the proximity of this tower to his residence; opposition to the health effects from RF radiation exposure; and asked the City Council to reconsider.

Regina Calvente, a La Palma resident, addressed the City Council regarding her opposition to the health effects from RF radiation exposure; opposition to the potential decrease in property values; requested an

assessment on the impact to the neighborhood; and asked the City Council to reconsider after all additional data is gathered.

Eric Carlstrom, a La Palma resident, addressed the City Council regarding his opposition to the health effects from RF radiation exposure.

City Attorney Thind announced that when the City Council is making a land use decision, they have wide discretion; however, pursuant to the Federal Telecommunications Act that limits this discretion in that the City Council is not allowed to take into consideration radio frequency emissions, health effects of it, whether or not radio frequency emissions have an effect on property values, that federal law preempts the City from taking that into consideration when making a decision on these types of applications. He added that while he understands the residents here coming in good faith and relaying these concerns, unfortunately, that cannot be a consideration when the City Council decides on permitting this application.

Mayor Goodman thanked City Attorney Thind for the legal guidance and noted that federal law supersedes City Council decisions.

Council Member Patel asked for clarification that the Council can make decisions regarding the height and aesthetics of the cell tower. City Attorney Thind concurred.

Charles Navarro, a La Palma resident, addressed the City Council regarding his opposition to the health effects from RF radiation exposure; opposition to the potential decrease in property values; and asked the City Council to reconsider.

Sharon Davidloo, a La Palma resident, addressed the City Council regarding her employer being a cell service provider and can concur that RF Radiation is in fact, a health concern.

5. Mayor Goodman closed the Public Hearing at 7:23p.m.

Council discussion ensued regarding the maximum height allowable for residential homes; that homes cannot be more than two stories or taller than 30 feet in the Single Family Residential (R-1) zone; that the proposed tower is on Public Institutional zoned property that has different development standards; that residents will be able to see the tower from their backyards; that the original proposal included more antennas that what was presented tonight; that Staff recommended that the applicant extend the height to cover the antennas; that at other sites where there are cell towers close to La Palma, some are within 120 to 200 feet of the homes; that at the City's north water well, there are two cell towers and

neither of them are concealed; that studies were conducted by the applicant that showed this installation would improve cellular service to residents; that other sites would not allow the height requirement needed to achieve the applicant's service coverage objective; that Council Member Patel opposes the height and look of the proposed cell tower; that Council Member Patel supports having more time to review this proposal and more community engagement before making a decision; that the applicant is not present at this meeting; that Council Member Keo Conklin noted health concerns with cell phone use; her support for further community engagement; her support for alternate coverage by use of wife; that her main concern is the health factor, the health hazard to residents; that she opposes the height and look of the tower; her support to conduct more studies on this and have AT&T reach out to the neighborhood to conduct a survey; that this could impact home values; that the City Council appreciates the public input; that Mayor Pro Tem Waldman inquired about the current height being proposed resulting in the tallest structure in La Palma next to the buildings in Centerpointe; that it is not aesthetically pleasing; that Mayor Goodman noted there are cell towers all over the United States and that most are not concealed; that he reminded the public that the City Council appreciates the public comments, but Federal Law limits their decisions to esthetics; that not having the applicant present to answer these questions is a disservice; and the general consensus by the City Council to continue this matter until more research is done and the applicant can be present.

3. Authorize the City of La Palma delegation the discretion to vote on any resolutions taking into consideration the information they receive at the conference.

Council Member Patel made a motion to designate Mayor Goodman as the City of La Palma's Voting Delegate and Council Member Baker as the Alternate Voting Delegate at the League of California Cities' (LOCC) Annual Conference; and authorize the City of La Palma delegation the discretion to vote on any resolutions taking into consideration the information they receive at the conference.

The motion was seconded by Council Member Baker and carried on the following vote:

22. *Central Park Multi-Sport Court Programming (Tennis/Pickleball)*

Recommendation that the City Council review and provide guidance on proposed multi-sport programming, including:

1. Confirming Pickleball Court Setup;
2. Exploring Pickleball Court Free Play Options:

Option 1: Free Play with the option to make a future reservation for a fee;

or

Option 2: Free Play with no option to make a future reservation for a fee.

3. Increasing the reservation fee from \$15 per hour per court, to \$20 per hour per court; and
4. Confirming Class Offerings.

City Manager McNamara introduced the Item and Public Works & Community Services Director Ramirez gave a general overview; Management Analyst Herrera gave a detailed report on the pickleball court upgrades; and Community Services Supervisor Adams gave a report on the options for pickleball court reservation programming.

City Manager McNamara added that although Staff is excited to roll out this reservation programming, that there is no perfect solution; that Staff supports Option 1 with an allowance for balanced open court times; and that Staff will evaluate the programming as this moves forward.

City Council Comments and Questions:

Discussion ensued regarding the current fees for tennis court reservations; the changes to the reservation system for both courts with this proposal; that you can reserve up to a month only, so as to not monopolize the courts; that reservations can be up to two times per week, per household; that Staff decided to roll back the six-month allowance for reservation with a more conservative approach; that this would assist with recreation's limited staffing; how the proposed Staff recommendation would look for the public; that tennis courts have a low reservation history of 3-5 per year; and that there's been an influx of calls for pickleball court reservations since its opening.

Public Input:

Jodee Tochi, a La Palma resident, addressed the City Council in support of open play for pickleball courts; her opposition to a reservation system; and her opposition to paying a fee to reserve the courts.

David Moulton, a Long Beach resident, addressed the City Council in support of open play for pickleball courts; and how staff will regulate reservations after hours.

Community Service Supervisor Adams responded that there are no reservations after 8:00p.m. and that after that, the courts would be free play until the court lights turn off at 10:00 p.m.

Teddy Lloyd, a Cerritos resident, addressed the City Council in support

creating revenue with the pickleball courts; that he has proposals for the City Council since the sport is growing; that Arnold Park in Cypress will soon have 8 pickleball courts; and his opposition to not having a wind breaker on the tennis court.

Morris Barahona, a Lakewood resident, addressed the City Council in support of pickleball; support for open play; and opposition to charging a fee.

Sal Romero, a Norwalk resident, addressed the City Council in support of pickleball; and that pickleball accommodates more players than tennis.

Further discussion ensued regarding support for staff's efforts on the pickleball court project and reservation system; that Council Member Baker supports Option 2; that Council Member Waldman supports Option 2; that if there are no reservations, the format returns to open play; that there are not a lot of reservations overall for tennis; that Mayor Goodman supports reservations being given to residents of La Palma as this is their court; that you could get up to 24 reservations per day, but depends upon the activity level; that this proposals is at the beginning stages and the format could change over time; that because Arnold Park is under construction, La Palma's pickleball courts are busier; that Cypress will not charge to reserve a pickleball court when Arnold Park opens up after construction; that charging for the pickleball courts reservations would allow La Palma residents to have play time on the courts; that the reservation system is subject to change; that giving residents the priority to reserve a pickleball court is supported by the City Council since they bought a home in La Palma and live in La Palma; that Staff will be evaluating this process in hopes that at some point changes can be made; that Council Member Keo Conklin supports giving residents priority, but is opposed to charging fees except for non-residents; that the current system is reservation only in order to confirm residency; whether the City has done a study on the staff time for this reservation process and rolling out this entire pickleball program; that there is going to be an increase in staff for reservation monitoring for pickleball; that City Manager McNamara is asking for Council direction, but there is an impact to staff with potential costs; that charging for reservations is a cost recovery method; that there is overall support to give residents priority; that the fee structure can always be adjusted at some point in the future; and that Mayor Goodman supports recovering costs for staff time; that Council Member Baker added that if there is no reservation, the courts would be open play; that Staff can revisit this in a few months and evaluate the fee structure; that Staff is responsible for covering the cost for services including pickleball; that Council Member Patel supports Option 1 as it gives residents priority and still allows for open play; and that Council Member Patel also wants to revisit this in three months.

Jodee Toshi, a La Palma resident, addressed the City Council regarding a pickleball game lasting more than one hour; that this format would not allow for

extended play; and that players bring their own nets with no cost to La Palma. Council Member Patel made a motion to approve Option 1 as recommended by Staff.

The motion was seconded by Council Member Baker and carried on the following vote:

2. If approved, direct staff to return with a proposed program and budget to be adopted in Fiscal Year 2025-26.

City Manager McNamara introduced the Item and Public Works and Community Services Director Ramirez gave an overview of the item; he then introduced Community Services Supervisor Adams who gave the Staff Report.

Council Comments and Questions:

Discussion ensued regarding inserting a mental health aspect into the platform for the Wellness Fair; support for Staff finding a date that doesn't conflict with other cities; appreciation for the Community Activities and Beautification (CAB) Committee's work on this project; support for having this fair catering to seniors; support for having this event in September; that the rough estimate for this fair is around \$5-6 thousand; support to give back to the seniors in the community; that La Palma residents frequent the Cerritos Senior Center because La Palma does not have a lot of activity that caters to the senior population, but that this is a great start; that Council Member Baker was appointed to the Orange County Older Adult Advisory Commission and supports events that assist our senior community; that the County can come share effective information with our seniors; and that Council Member Keo Conklin requested to add hospice or bereavement care to the Fair.

Council Member Patel made a motion to approve the Community Activities and Beautification (CAB) Committee's recommendation to offer a Health & Wellness

Fair for Seniors in the Fall of 2025; and direct staff to return with a proposed program and budget to be adopted in Fiscal Year 2025-26.

The motion was seconded by Council Member Conklin and carried on the following vote:

CITY MANAGER REMARKS
